



As David Punter aptly writes, the Gothic "has inflected form and meaning across a huge range of cultural discourses, from medieval architecture to contemporary gaming; from graveyard poetry to modern dance; from the eighteenth-century novel to internet fiction."

During our workshop, we aim to look at a variety of discourses loosely connected with the Gothic - its traditional uses as well as its echoes in contemporary media.
